






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1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 OBJECTIVES OF THE SCAN

This report, prepared by Econet, at the request of the **Regional Cooperation Council**, hereafter **RCC**, aims to provide the client with a Funding Audit or Grant Scan report with European Funding opportunities, including Cascade Funding.

Within the "Support programme for development of Digital Innovation Hubs in the Western Balkans" service, this document contains the available European funding lines to which Western Balkans Digital Innovation Hubs (DIHs), hereafter, WB DIHs and entities of the DIHs ecosystem can apply for public funding in the areas of interest identified, namely:

- > Bolstering innovation ecosystems and fostering networking opportunities for DIHs in the region and promoting collaboration with other EU regions.
- Providing advice and access to the digital transformation process for businesses.
- Training in advanced technologies and knowledge transfer to SMEs, as well as capacity-building schemes to empower DIHs in the WB.

In this way, Econet responds to the agreed agreement to provide professional assistance and to maximize the opportunity to obtain public funding.

In order to perform the service with optimal results, it has been taken into consideration the information provided during the initial kick-off meeting with RCC, where key challenges and aspirations for the DIHs in the Western Balkans region were discussed. Thus, the RCC emphasised that many DIHs in the region are in their initial stages, grappling with limited resources and a lack of expertise to fully exploit available opportunities. It was clear that there is a need not just to target the few matured DIHs but to ensure a more inclusive approach. The RCC also highlighted their intention to prioritise funding opportunities that would foster networking, experience sharing, and capacity building.

With this information in mind, a search and mapping of existing funding programmes was carried out based on the objectives, activities and interests of RCC and the WB DIHs in order to identify the most appropriate funding instruments available to develop their project/s.

1.2 HOW TO USE THE GRANT SCAN

This report is structured as follows:

On the one hand, it contains an introduction to the **RCC** and **WB DIHs** interests, extracted from the "Mapping of Digital Innovation Hubs and identification of needs within Western Balkans and of prospective regional cooperation actions", as well as information provided during the initial kick-off meeting with the **RCC**.

Thus, point 2 includes information on the main lines of action identified for this Funding Audit.





On the other hand, point 3 as the core part of the report includes the Funding Audit for the project/s at European level. In this Funding Audit, the opportunities presented are related to the calls of interest, giving a general description of them and a justification of the fit of the potential project. A calendar related to these opportunities is presented in point 4.

The report concludes with point 5, with a series of recommendations and conclusions for the presentation of applications. Special attention was given to opportunities in the period 23-24.

2. INTRODUCTION TO WB DIHS AND ITS INTERESTS IN SEEKING FUNDING

2.1 THE WB DIHS

Digital Innovation Hubs (DIHs) in the Western Balkans region are mechanisms envisaged to empower and accelerate the digital transformation processes across the six economies - Albania, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Kosovo*1, Montenegro, North Macedonia, and Serbia. The aspiration of the RCC is to align the Western Balkans more closely with the European Union, driven by the Common Regional Market (CRM) Action Plan 2021-2024.

Currently, the RCC's initiative aims to mould these hubs in a manner analogous to the exemplary European DIHs, which have been recognised for their excellence by the European Commission. The primary essence of these hubs, evident from the RCC's mapping, is to provide basic, supplementary services.

RCC VISION FOR WB DIHs

Position WB DIHs as one-stop solutions for regional SMEs, enabling them to seamlessly tap into technical, human, and financial resources essential for their digital evolution.

The main asset of the **WB DIHs** is its partners, who contribute towards providing a comprehensive offer of services in line with the industries' challenges whilst offering complementarity to existing commercial services as **DIH**. In this way, thanks to the technical and business knowledge provided by the consortium partners, digitalisation is made available to all regional companies.

Therefore, the **WB DIHs** act as catalysts, connecting businesses and public administrations with innovative solutions, offering a holistic perspective.

MISSION OF WB DIHs

Propel regional enterprises into the digital age, encouraging the adoption of innovative business models, and thereby amplifying their competitive advantage.

2.2 WB DIHS'S INCOME STRUCTURE

The analysis of the expected income structure of WB DIHs, has a dual approach:

- > the private income that a Hub obtains selling services to their clients, sponsoring some activities and with in-kind contributions made by partners
- > the public income that will correspond to the funds that **WB DIHs** expects to secure in several public funding programmes.

Public authorities play a key role supporting DIHs, mainly during the initial phases related to the creation, and the initial launch of their services portfolio. The funding structure of **WB DIHs** has a significant forecast of income from public funds, so it is important to have this overview of the main European public funding opportunities for the years 2023-2024.

In order to maximise the operational capacity of the **WB DIHs**, it is necessary to have enough resources to **deploy service portfolio**, thus it is interesting to find specific programs aimed at funding the costs associated with the implementation of digital transformation services.

Another type of activities where there is room for specific opportunities to fund activities to be developed by the **WB DIHs** is related to **digital training**.

In addition to the activities more closely related to the tasks of building and strengthening the service portfolio, it is also necessary to take into account the core funding needed to carry out those tasks of transversal nature that must be addressed by the partners, such as **management** and communication activities.

Funding Opportunities Highlighted in This Document:

It's important to differentiate between the types of grants and funding opportunities available. Some grants can be directly accessed by the DIHs and their member entities. On the other hand, there are grants that businesses can seek, with the support and guidance of the DIHs. However, this document focuses on the support available to either DIHs directly, or to their member entities, considering public entities, Research and Technology Organisations (RTOs) and business associations, preferably.





FUNDING POSSIBILITIES FOR WB DIHS

In the evolving digital landscape of the Western Balkans, access to pertinent and synergistic funding sources is pivotal for the amplification and expansion of Digital Innovation Hubs (DIHs). Given the varying stages of maturity and capacity observed among the **WB DIHs**, there's a need for not just individual but also collaborative approaches in garnering support. Thus, central to this report's objectives is the identification of such funding programmes where at least two or more economies of the Western Balkans and the European Union can jointly participate. The shared vision is to encourage opportunities for experience exchange and best practice benchmarking, foster inter-regional networking, and cultivate capabilities.

This section aims to elucidate these funding opportunities, ranging from broad cooperative programmes such as Interreg or Erasmus, which foster general collaboration, to more specific initiatives centred on digitalisation projects, like Horizon Europe (HE) or the DIGITAL programme. Each presented opportunity is selected based on its potential to drive forward the collective growth of **WB DIHs**, helping them transition from their current roles of offering basic supplementary services to evolving into one-stop solutions for businesses keen on digital transformation.

3.1 INTERREG PROGRAMMES

Interreg programme started in 1989 and from its launch it has stimulated cooperation between regions in and out of the European Union. These programmes play a vital role in operating from different perspectives with the common objective of reducing the obstacles of national borders in the European Union. In general, the different programmes structured under Interreg seek to strengthen economic and institutional collaboration, through cooperation projects framed in different thematic areas depending on the characteristics and particularities of each strand of territorial cooperation program. For the 2021-2027 period, Interreg is focused on addressing current challenges through the priorities of smart growth, green transition, social inclusion, territorial development, efficient and sustainable infrastructure.

In general terms, the eligibility of costs are staff cost, office and administration, travel and accommodation and external expertise. Other eligible costs are equipment expenditure as well as costs of infrastructure and works, where the link with the project must be motivated.

Several Interreg cooperation programmes highlight participation between Western Balkan economies and other European economies, aiming to foster networking and collaboration:

Strand of cooperation: Interreg B

Interreg B involves regions from several economies of the EU forming bigger areas. It aims to promote better cooperation and regional development within the Union by a joint approach to tackle common issues. Interreg B supports a wide range of project investment related to innovation, environment, accessibility, telecommunications, urban development etc. The following involve economies on which this service focuses.





- Interreg DANUBE
- Interreg Balkan Mediterranean
- Interreg EURO-MED

Strand of cooperation: IPA

The Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance (IPA) is based on partnerships with the EU candidate economies and potential candidate economies. It supports administrative, social and economic reforms, as well as regional co-operation. The following involve economies on which this service focuses.

- Interreg IPA CBC Bulgaria Serbia

Following this list, detailed profiles of the most pertinent programmes are presented, as they encompass several economies of the **WB DIHs** and have either upcoming or already published opening dates.

3.1.1 INTERREG EURO-MED

Its cooperation area covers 69 regions in 14 economies: 10 EU Member States and 4 Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance (IPA) economies: **Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, and the Republic of North Macedonia**. Around 25% of the European Union + 4 IPA economies, representing more than 140 million people, can benefit from these funds.

Taking into account **WB DIHs** general scope, funding opportunities under the following priority and specific objective of the programme can be identified:

Priority 1: A Smarter Mediterranean (thematic project)

> Specific objective 1.1: Developing and enhancing research and innovation capacities and the uptake of advanced technologies.

The project shall contribute to the following Programme output indicators:

- Strategies and action plans jointly developed
- Jointly developed solutions
- Organisations cooperating across borders





The project should reflect the following Results indicators:

- Joint strategies and action plans taken up by organisations
- > Solutions taken up or up scaled by organisations
- Organisations with increased institutional capacity due to their participation in cooperation activities across borders

Considering the Western Balkans participation in this programme and that the projects can be developed and managed by public administrations, universities, private and civil society organisations, it can be considered for **WB DIHs** to apply.

The calls for proposal have been announced, however the opening dates may be subjected to change.

Recommendations for WB DIHs	The Interreg Euro-MED call presents a propitious opportunity for the WB DIHs from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, North Macedonia, and Albania to fortify their objectives of digital innovation. Importantly, with the programme's expansive reach across both EU and pre-accession nations, it bridges the aspirations of the Western Balkans with broader European ambitions.	

3.1.2 INTERREG DANUBE

The new programme area covers the same **14 economies** that participate in the Danube Transnational Programme 2014-2020.

In the EU Member States, the programme area covers Austria, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Romania, Slovakia, and Slovenia. The neighboring economies that belong to the programme area are **Bosnia and Herzegovina**, Moldova, **Montenegro**, **Serbia**, and Ukraine.





Compared to other EU macro-regions, the Danube region has the highest number of economies – and at the same time the highest share of border regions. Apart from Germany and Ukraine, all states are part of the programme area with their entire territory, accounting all together for 70 NUTS2 regions.

Eligible applicants include public authorities, non-profit organizations, educational institutions, research organizations, and other relevant stakeholders from the Danube region. Each project has to involve at least three financing project partners from three different economies of the programme area.

To assist potential applicants with project generation and the application process, they will provide individual consultations and organizing information events and webinars. Recommendations for WB DIHs	Similarly to the previous Programme, with its expansive reach, Interreg Danube presents a good opportunity to synergize with a diverse group of 14 economies, both within and outside the EU, bridging Western Balkan aspirations with broader European objectives. Ensure your projects have a minimum of three financing partners from different economies, but consider expanding this for richer collaborations. The Interreg Danube programme has robust support mechanisms in place, such as individual consultations, information events, and webinars. Participate





actively in these to gain insights, clarify doubts, and strengthen your application. Regularly check the Interreg Danube's official website and social media channels.

3.1.3 INTERREG IPA CBC PROGRAMME CROATIA-BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA-MONTENEGRO

The programme aims to strengthen social, economic, and territorial development of the cross-border area. The area includes 12 counties in Croatia, Brčko District, and 109 municipalities in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and 12 municipalities in Montenegro. It aims to reduce disparities in development and increase the capacity of the programme area to recover from the economic crisis.

The Programme's strategic objective is to foster smart, green, and inclusive development of the cross-border region by implementing joint projects within the framework of three EU policy objectives: Smarter Europe, Greener Europe, and More Social Europe.

The Interreg programme has four key priorities: smart investments in research, innovation, and competitive entrepreneurship; green investments in environmental protection and efficient risk management; accessible and resilient health services; and sustainable and inclusive tourism and culture.

Cross-border dimension of projects is crucial, and it must involve partners from at least 2 programme economies (one must be from Member State - Croatia).

Applicant/partner must meet all the following criteria:

- be a non-profit-making legal person/entity established by a public or a private law
- profit-making companies are not eligible -unless established and 100% owned by state, regional/local government units
- be established under the domestic law in the respective participating economy
- be registered at least 12 months prior to the deadline for the submission of applications.
- > private partner (to be checked the minimal annual income in the last two closed financial years).

Recommendations for WB DIHs	Similarly to the previous programme, the cross-border dimension of the programme promotes collaborative synergies. Since the projects mandate participation from at least two programme economies, this offers the WB DIHs an avenue to consolidate inter-economy relations, aligning both with Croatian entities, an EU member state, and strengthening regional integration. Furthermore, given that the WB DIHs typically operate under non-profit umbrellas or are often aligned with public institutions, they meet the applicant/partner criteria laid out by the Interreg programme. This positions them advantageously to not just apply but also to lead collaborative projects in the realm of digitalisation in the cross-border region.

ECONET RECOMMENDATION



- 1. A prioritisation approach of multi-economy Interreg programmes is recommended, for the design of projects that can have a broader impact across multiple economies:
 - Interreg DANUBE
 - Interreg EURO-MED
 - Interreg IPA ADRION
- 2. Consider replicating similar project scopes for different programmes to maximize the chances of securing funding and enabling the sharing of best practices across various projects.
- 3. Engage with other European partners who regularly participate in these programmes. This information is available at https://keep.eu/
- 4. It is essential to keep up to date with the publication of calls for proposals (in most cases, new calls are expected in 2024, although this varies with each programme). Generally, the programmes have tools for partner search, as well as info days and events, useful for this purpose.






3.2 HORIZON EUROPE

The 9th Framework Programme, also known as Horizon Europe, replaced the previous programme Horizon 2020 (H2020), as of January 2021 with a budget of €100 billion.

The structure of Horizon Europe, which can be described as an evolution of H2020, lays under three distinct Pillars, supported by activities to widen participation and strengthening the European Research Area (ERA), each part contributing to the common Horizon Europe objectives:



The description of these pillars is the following one:

- **Pillar 1 Excellent science**: aiming to increase the EU's global scientific competitiveness.
- Pillar 2 Global Challenges & European Industrial Competitiveness: supporting research relating to societal challenges and reinforcing technological and industrial capacities through clusters. It sets Missions, that will have specific goals and will be launched from within the pillar, establishing a comprehensive portfolio of projects.
- **Pillar 3 Innovative Europe**: stimulating market-creating breakthroughs and ecosystems conducive to innovation.
- **Widening Participation and Strengthening the European Research Area**: optimising strengths & potential for a more innovative Europe.

The most interesting opportunities for WB DIHs would be found in **Pillar 3 Innovative Europe** and **Widening Participation and Strengthening the European Research Area**. In addition, individual opportunities of potential interest to DIH members are also identified in Pillars I and II.

Please note that, in order to participate in Horizon Europe, any entity should previously do some steps:





- 1. ECCAS Account. To register an account, each Team Member should go to the EU Login account page
- **2. PIC Number.** You need to register your organization to participate in a proposal or call. Follow the link to register your organisation to get a PIC number
- **3. Follow the next steps required** to assign a LEAR, register and validate your bank account, etc.

3.2.1. OPPORTUNITIES IN PILLAR III

This pillar will focus on scaling up breakthrough and market-creating innovation through a new European Innovation Council (EIC) as well as activities aimed at enhancing and developing the overall European innovation landscape. It will also include support to the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT).

Pillar III aims to foster all forms of innovation, including breakthrough innovation, and market deployment of innovative solutions.

The European Innovation Council will build on the success of the Enhanced EIC pilot in Horizon 2020 and will serve as a 'one-stop shop' for European innovators. It will channel funding through two main instruments:

Accelerator – this instrument will bridge the financing gap between late stages of innovation activities and market take-up to effectively deploy breakthrough market-creating innovation and scale up companies. The Accelerator is one of the most interesting instruments for the **WB DIHs** because it provides market entry and market deployment support to technology companies in the form of blended finance. EIC blended finance includes part grant or reimbursable advance (to cover innovation activities) and part investment, either via equity or other forms of investment such as convertible notes, loans, guarantees, etc., for the actual market deployment of the company.

Pathfinder – building on the success of the Future and Emerging Technologies (FET) Open scheme this instrument will support future and emerging breakthrough technologies.

European Innovation Ecosystems will connect with regional and domestic innovation actors and support the implementation of joint cross-border innovation programmes by Member States and Associated Countries, enhancing soft skills for innovation in addition to other types of research and innovation actions. Actions will complement the ERDF support for innovation eco-systems and interregional partnerships around smart specialisation topics.

The calls in this block could be very relevant for **WB DIHs** because it could be used to reinforce actions to build and dynamise the ecosystem surrounding the Hub.

The European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT) will continue to fund existing Knowledge and Innovation Communities (KICs), whilst looking to establish new KICs in emerging priority areas, which will help to strengthen sustainable innovation ecosystems across Europe. The Institute will also foster the development of entrepreneurial skills and innovation via





a 'lifelong learning perspective' and support the entrepreneurial transformation of European universities. Finally, the EIT will also bring new solutions for global societal challenges to the market, thus contributing to the objectives of the 'Global Challenges and European Industrial Competitiveness' pillar.

As of the date of this document (November 2022), there are opportunities for **WB DIHs** in the EIC and in the European Innovation Ecosystems.

3.2.1.1 European innovation ecosystems

It is possible that the **WB DIHs** itself, could play a role in this Coordination and Support Actions. Participating in them would have the great added value of being able to directly apply methodologies and knowledge from other areas of Europe in the Western Balkans (these projects involve several partners spread across the continent working towards a common goal).

3.2.2. WIDENING PARTICIPATION AND STRENGTHENING THE EUROPEAN RESEARCH AREA

Widening Participation and Spreading Excellence actions under Horizon Europe contribute to building research and innovation capacity of Member States, Associated Countries and **Outermost Regions that underperform in terms of R&I performance**. This last aspect makes Widening particularly attractive for **WB DIHs**.

The actions will strengthen economies' potential for successful participation in transnational research and innovation projects, promote networking and access to excellence.

Participants in the programme will be able to upgrade their research and innovation systems, making them stronger and allowing the EU as a whole to advance together, in line with the policy objectives of the European Research Area.

3.2.3. OTHER POTENTIAL OPPORTUNITIES WITHIN HORIZON EUROPE: PILLAR 2

Pillar II moves beyond the societal challenges familiar under Horizon 2020, tackling major global challenges and addressing Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) which aim to 'improve people's lives and to protect the planet for future generation'. At the same time the calls under Pillar II will address Europe's competitiveness in technology, embracing challenges which are often complex and require interdisciplinary solutions and activities from research to innovation. Pillar II is organised into six clusters, with a supporting area (JRC activities), and crosscutting 'Missions'.







3.2.3.1 Cluster 2: Culture, Creativity and Inclusive society

This cluster aims to strengthen European democratic values, including rule of law and fundamental rights, safeguarding our cultural heritage, and promoting socio-economic transformations that contribute to inclusion and growth.

This cluster is structured in three intervention areas: democracy; cultural heritage; and social and economic transformations. In some of the calls, technological advances and application of Information and Communication Technologies are required. Although these areas are not aligned with the main focus of **WB DIHs** identified necessities, in certain types of projects, it may be interesting to add a use case in the Western Balkans within a project led from another European country.

Taking into account the Work Programme 2023-2024, Econet has identified this call where there are possibilities for **WB DIHs** members to participate as partners.

3.2.3.2 Cluster 3: Civil Security for Society

Cluster 3 has the vision to support wider EU responses to those security challenges while ensuring free movement and protecting the integrity of the Schengen area. This means supporting "a resilient and more stable Europe that protects" as well as for this purpose supporting a competitive European civil security industry sector. As those challenges are rapidly evolving and social and technological developments are making a response increasingly complex, security research can serve as a tool to move from a reactive approach to security to a proactive approach based on foresight, prevention and anticipation.

Cluster 3 will support in particular the Commission policy priority 'Promoting our European way of life', as well as 'European Green Deal' and 'Europe fit for the digital age'. It will in particular support the implementation of the Security Union Strategy, the **Counter-Terrorism Agenda**, the border management and security dimensions of the **New Pact on Migration and Asylum**, **EU Disaster Risk Reduction** policies, the **EU Maritime Security Strategy** and the **EU Cybersecurity Strategy**.

In the Digital Agenda for the Western Balkans⁵, European Commission together with Ministers from six Western Balkan partners — Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo*, Montenegro, North Macedonia and Serbia — commit to Increasing cybersecurity, trust and digitalisation of industry: The EU and the Western Balkan region have a common objective to improve online security and trust. It is a relevant fact that Western Balkans are the ones who have experienced the most internet security problems, especially related to viruses, attacks on networks and illegal access.

ECONET RECOMMENDATION AND NEXT STEPS



Econet advises WB DIHs to take on the role of coordinator when submitting proposals for "Excellence Hubs" as well as for calls associated with the European Innovation Ecosystem.

For other calls, the general recommendation is for both WB DIHs and its members to participate as partners. It's crucial to recognize that such participation can bolster their Curriculum Vitae (CV) and augment their visibility within the programme:

- Follow the updates of the new "Funding and tenders" portal and use its tools to search for potential partners: link
- 2. Participate in events and Infodays organized at EU level, especially those one with matchmaking and pitches in order to positioning as partners.

3.3. CASCADE FUNDING

Cascade funding is a funding scheme proposed by the European Commission in which consortia are in charge of distributing money to SMEs or academia in different topics.

Increasingly, the European Commission is opting for the cascading funding scheme. The European Commission delivers money to a consortium and this consortium is responsible to distribute this money among SMEs in different Topics.

In the previous macro funding programme (H2020), large projects were approved that continue to distribute cascade funding today. In addition, the new programme (Horizon Europe) proposes new projects of this kind.

Various consortia were granted funds in order to, in turn, provide funds to digital start-ups, SMEs or scale-ups; and the aim is to ensure that funding is easily accessible through processes that are shorter in time, not as demanding and often more likely to succeed since each consortium has specific goals and the applicants are able to focus on those which are closer to their needs.

These processes are structured in what is known as open calls, and they are competitive, focused on distributing EC public funds to start-ups in order to:

- > Select tech start-ups, or scale-ups for acceleration or incubation;
- > Support pilots, demonstrations or experiments undertaken by start-ups or SMEs on specific innovative technology or frameworks;
- > Support extensions of the existing experimentation support capacity of the project adding new platforms or partners to extend its scope or to address specific tasks.
- Each consortium can decide how to organize their open calls, and this means some of them to offer direct funding and some others, vouchers for support services or free access and support to use their testing facilities. In any case, this support usually ranges between 50.000 and 250.000 €.

In the recent past, there were open calls centred on Digital Innovation Hubs (DIHs) such as DIH2, i4trust, and Euhubs4Data. Unfortunately, the current landscape lacks open calls with a direct emphasis on DIHs. Consequently, in this document, our focus regarding cascade funding adopts a more expansive perspective. We explore opportunities that not only cater to the participation

of the WB DIHs but also highlight scenarios where these hubs can endorse and guide SMEs.

Therefore, based on the unique focus and sector of each DIH, it's recommended to conduct a tailored search through the participant's portal (see the "recommendations" table above) to pinpoint appropriate opportunities. An interesting point of reference here would be the calls from <u>Euroclusters</u>. Even though they predominantly adopt a sector-specific approach, they bear potential relevance to the aspirations. of WB DIHs.







Next, we select some opportunities that might be of interest of WB DIHs. However, it's important to understand that this enumeration is not exhaustive.

3.4 DIGITAL EUROPE PROGRAMME

The Digital Europe Programme aims to accelerate economic recovery and drive the digital transformation of Europe by boosting investments in supercomputing, artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, advanced digital skills, and ensuring a wide use of digital technologies across the economy and society, including through Digital Innovation Hubs. With a planned overall budget of €7.6 billion (in current prices), its goal is to improve Europe's competitiveness in the global digital economy and increase its technological autonomy, bringing benefits to everyone, but in particular to small and medium-sized enterprises.

The Commission signed on 30 June 2023 partnership agreements for the Digital Europe Programme with **Montenegro, North Macedonia, Albania and Serbia**, on the margins of the Regulatory Dialogue with the Western Balkans.

In particular, participants from these four economies will be able to take part in projects that deploy digital technologies across the EU in specific areas such as artificial intelligence, and advanced digital skills. They will also be able to set up Digital Innovation Hubs in their own regions.

DIGITAL Programme priorities are:

- 1) Supercomputing €2.2 billion to:
 - Build up and strengthen the EU's supercomputing and data processing capacities by buying world-class exascale supercomputers by 2022/2023 and post exascale facilities by 2026/2027.
 - Increase accessibility and broaden the use of supercomputing in areas of public interest such as health, environment and security, and in industry, including small and medium-sized enterprises.
- 2) Artificial intelligence €2.1 billion to:
 - Invest in and open up the use of artificial intelligence by businesses and public administrations.
 - Set up a true European data space and facilitate safe access to and storage of large datasets and trustworthy and energy-efficient cloud infrastructure.
 - Strengthen and support existing artificial intelligence testing and experimentation facilities in areas such as health and mobility in Member States and encourage their cooperation.
- 3) Cybersecurity €1.6 billion to:
 - Strengthening cybersecurity coordination between Member States tools and data infrastructures.
 - Support the wide deployment of cybersecurity capacities across the economy.
- 4) Advanced digital skills €580 million to:
 - Support the design and delivery of specialized programmes and traineeships for the future experts in key capacity areas like data and AI, cybersecurity, quantum and HPC.
 - Support the upskilling of the existing workforce through short trainings reflecting the latest developments in key capacity areas.
- 5) Ensuring the wide use of digital technologies across the economy and society €1.1 billion to:





- Support high impact deployments in areas of public interest, such as health (complemented by EU4Health programme), Green Deal, smart communities and the cultural sector.
- Build up and strengthen the network of European Digital Innovation Hubs, aiming to have a Hub in every region, to help companies benefit from digital opportunities.
- Support the uptake of advanced digital and related technologies by the industry, notably small and medium-sized enterprises.

Below is a table with the main characteristics of a call that has been key to shaping the current map of European Digital Innovation Hubs, and where the Hubs based in Montenegro, North Macedonia, Albania and Serbia will be able to participate once the new call is launched, expected in January 2024. Kosovo* is also under negotiations to join the programme so Hubs can also participate in the future.

3.5 Erasmus +

Erasmus+ is the EU programme supporting education, training, youth and sport in Europe. Its budget is estimated at €26.2 billion. This is almost double that of its predecessor programme from 2014 to 2020. Between 2021 and 2027, the programme places particular emphasis on social inclusion, green and digital transformation and promoting young people's participation in democratic life.

For most actions in Erasmus+, organisation will need to be located in a programme country. Programme countries are the EU member states and a short list of other economies associated to the Programme, including **Montenegro, North Macedonia, Albania and Serbia.**

Kosovo* is among the "non-associated third countries (Partner Countries)". Third countries not associated to the Programme may participate in certain Actions of the Programme, subject to certain criteria or conditions. Therefore, the mode of participation must be review in detail, in order to ensure the eligibility of the proposed activities.

The Commission launched the call for proposals for 2023 under the Erasmus+ programme. With an annual budget of €4.2 billion, Erasmus+ is increasing its support for inclusion, active citizenship and democratic participation, and green and digital transformations in the EU and internationally.





The latest work programme available as of today is 2023, with no open calls identified at this stage. However, calls of interest are expected in WP 2024. Tentative information on the most interesting actions for **WB DIHs** are shown in the following tables.

As the 2024 dates are a forecast, watch out for the calls foreseen in the 2024 Work Programme. Plan and prepare your proposals in advance to adapt them to the expected areas of interest.

Taking into account **WB DIHs** needs, and in order to be aware of the different calls for proposals and to search for partners, it is recommended as an action plan:





A) For EU Programmes, Ordinary Calls:

- Prepare a Partner Profile with WB DIHs information and expertise.
- > Get the PIC number and be sure all steps for its validation will be done.
- > Upload profile in topics of interest. Each call topic has a specific section "Partner Section", where you can showcase your interest in participating by adding your organisation profile.

B) For Cascade Funding

- > Register in the different Contact Lists and newsletters of the projects identified in this document, in order to receive regularly updated information,
- > Follow them on social networks.
- > Go to the partner search sections of the calls/programmes pages to identify partners that could be of interest in the case of calls that require a partnership.
- Periodically check the EU Portal for new projects providing cascade funding.
- Register on the www.fundingbox.com platform where all existing cascade funding opportunities are collected.

At the same time, it is very important to keep updating the funding opportunities because, as mentioned at different points in the document, there are interesting calls for proposals for **WB DIHs** and its partners to be published in the coming months.

As a final recommendation as many programmes/ projects require partnership (consortia) to apply for funding we recommend in order to become a part of those consortia to search take the following steps:

- > Sign up to the different contact lists and newsletters from the different programmes and projects in order to receive updated information about them.
- > Follow the different programmes and projects on social networks.
- Refer to the different programmes to the "partner search" sections in order to identify potential partners.

Sign up to Fundingbox platform where you can have access to the different cascade funding opportunities and also a space for partner search.





6. ANNEX
